## NRC SEEKS PUBLIC COMMENT ON DRAFT REVIEW STANDARD FOR EARLY SITE PERMIT APPLICATIONS

The Nuclear Regulatory Commission is requesting comments on its draft review standard for early site permit (ESP) applications for nuclear power plants.

The ESP process is intended to permit resolution of site-related issues regarding possible future construction and operation of a nuclear power plant at a site selected by an applicant. The review standard will be used by NRC staff in its review of an ESP application and informs potential applicants and other stakeholders of the information the staff needs to perform its review.

The draft review standard is available for public inspection and duplication through the NRC's Public Document Room located at One White Flint North, 11555 Rockville Pike, Rockville, Maryland, and from ADAMS, the NRC's Agencywide Documents Access and Management System. Any interested person may submit comments on the draft review standard. However, to be certain of consideration, comments must be received by March 31, 2003. Comments received after the due date will be considered if it is practical to do so.
