## NRC PUBLIC MEETING ON JULY 17 ON UPDATING GENERIC ENVIRONMENTAL IMPACT STATEMENT FOR LICENSE RENEWAL

The Nuclear Regulatory Commission will hold a public meeting July 17 in Boston, concerning an update of its Generic Environmental Impact Statement (GEIS) for License Renewal of Nuclear Plants, originally published in 1996. The meeting is one of four being held throughout the country.

The meeting will be held at the Executive Conference Center (adjacent to the Double Tree-Bayside) 200 Mount Vernon Street in Boston.

Members of the public are invited to comment on issues that the NRC should consider in its GEIS update. NRC staff will be available for informal discussions at 6 p.m., answering questions and providing additional information about the scoping process. The formal meeting to receive public comments will start at 7 p.m.

The GEIS assesses the overall scope and impact of environmental effects associated with license renewal at any nuclear power plant site. Separate supplements to the GEIS are prepared to assess specific environmental issues at individual plants when a license renewal application is submitted for that plant.
