NRC NAMES DEPUTY REGIONAL ADMINISTRATOR FOR CONSTRUCTION IN ITS ATLANTA REGIONAL OFFICE

The U.S. Nuclear Regulatory Commission has named Frederick Brown the Deputy Regional Administrator for Construction in the agency's Region II office in Atlanta. That position has responsibility for NRC inspection and oversight activities at new NRC-licensed construction sites across the country.



Brown joined the NRC in 1994 in the Region III office near Chicago and his experience there included assignments as a fuel cycle resident inspector, senior reactor project engineer and reactor senior resident inspector. He moved to the NRC's headquarters in Rockville, Md. in 2000 and held supervisory positions in the industrial and medical program as well as the high level waste program.

At NRC headquarters, he assisted in the formation of the NRC's Office of New Reactors by leading the administrative support division for the first year of that office's existence. Brown then headed up the Division of Inspection and Regional Support within the NRC's Office of Nuclear Reactor Regulation for about five years preceding his selection as the Deputy Regional Administrator for Construction.

Brown received a B.S. degree from the United States Merchant Marine Academy in Kings Point, N.Y., and is a graduate of the NRC's Senior Executive Service or SES Candidate Development Program. Prior to joining the NRC, Brown held various engineering and management positions at the now-closed Mare Island Naval Shipyard in Vallejo, Calif.

Brown replaces Chuck Casto, who is now the Regional Administrator in the NRC's Region III office.
