NRC Assigns Senior Resident Inspector to Nuclear Fuel Services In Erwin, Tenn.



Nuclear Regulatory Commission officials in Atlanta have named Charles Stancil Jr. as the senior resident inspector at the Nuclear Fuel Services fuel facility in Erwin, Tenn.

Stancil joined the NRC in 2004 as a reactor engineer in the agency's Region IV office in Arlington, Tex. He transferred to the Region II office in Atlanta and served as resident inspector for more than seven years at the Browns Ferry nuclear plant in Alabama.

Before joining the NRC, Stancil served more than 12 years in the U. S. Navy and achieved the qualification of Engineering Officer on nuclear submarines. After leaving the Navy, he spent 20 years in the commercial nuclear industry where he worked in licensing, procurement engineering, operations and earned his senior reactor operator license.

Stancil received a bachelor of science degree in ocean engineering from the U. S. Naval Academy.

“Charlie Stancil is an experienced inspector committed to safety,” said NRC Region II Administrator Victor McCree. “He will work to carry out the NRC mission of protecting people and the environment by helping ensure the safe operation of Nuclear Fuel Services.”

NRC resident inspectors serve as the agency's eyes and ears at some fuel fabrication facilities and all commercial nuclear power plants. They conduct inspections, monitor major work projects and interact with plant workers and the public. Resident inspectors can serve at one site for up to seven years.
